On Christ the King Sunday, I mentioned in my homily the Enthronement of the Sacred Heart in the home. I recently brought back materials from the Marian Catechist Apostolate in La Crosse, Wis., that our parish will have available for your purchase. Advent Mission at St. Rose

Fr. Ed Brodsky, FSSP will give an Advent Mission at St. Rose Parish beginning on Sunday, November 29th at both morning masses, and then continuing on with evening masses and sermons on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday.

The theme of Father's talks will be, John 12:35 "Walk whilst you have the light, that darkness overtake you not."

The schedule will be as follows:

Confessions will be at 5:30pm, Mass at 6pm (no sermon), mission conference at 7pm, followed by another round of confessions. The daily Mass schedule will remain unchanged, so the evening Masses will be in addition to normal Mass times.

Funeral Arrangements

Parishioners have asked about our office providing documents that could be completed specifying that they want to be buried from St. Rose Church. Fr. Portzer recently met with a representative of Duker and Haugh to discuss the legality of such a form.

Anyone who has preferences is advised to write a letter to the parish telling us what you want. It is recommended to plan in advance for a funeral with the funeral home of your choice. If you pre-plan and fully pay, chances of anything being changed are extremely low. Even if you just sit down with the funeral home and have your wishes written down and on file, that carries a lot of weight, more than it does if it is on file here at St. Rose only. Duker and Haugh keeps a file on everyone who speaks to them about their preferences, even if it is only an informal conversation, and they use that file when the person dies. Other funeral homes can advise you how they handle informal conversations.
