Owing to a Lack of a Cry Room

When you have a crying or extremely talkative child, particularly during the sermon, the Canon of the Mass, or when the Propers of the Mass texts are sung by the choir, I kindly ask you to make use of the vestibule. Staying inside of the church, especially in the back and below the choir loft, has an amplifying effect. The back of the church with the space under the choir loft functions as a resonating body and makes your child's voice seem even louder. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation, and above all, for your presence here at St. Rose.
