The religious education talks that I will be giving begin today, Sept. 6, from about 9:15 am to 10:00 am. These are open to everyone.

As I mentioned last week, I will begin with the topic of the reliable sources of theological information. In our "information age" with its superabundance not only of information but also misinformation and disinformation, it's important to know what sources we can rely on theologically. Beyond that, it is also important to know how much weight a theological position has. Many debates go on the internet that are, to be honest, pretty much a waste of everyone's time, because they lack either the proper foundations or the proper sense of where a proposition stands theologically. So, I hope that at least one benefit from the talks is that you won't waste your time!

I expect this series will take at least two sessions and may take three. I've received some good and interesting suggestions for subsequent talks, so please feel free to bring them up to me.

When you have a crying or extremely talkative child, particularly during the sermon, the Canon of the Mass, or when the Propers of the Mass texts are sung by the choir, I kindly ask you to make use of the vestibule. Staying inside of the church, especially in the back and below the choir loft, has an amplifying effect. The back of the church with the space under the choir loft functions as a resonating body and makes your child's voice seem even louder.
