Our Church News

FROM THE DESK OF FR. D.



The scene of the temptation, which opens the public life of Jesus declares in the Gospels in a very forceful manner the great change in our lives that He introduces into the world by His work of redemption. Where Adam fell, Christ, the new Head of humanity, triumphs over the power of Satan: at the time of His passion “the prince of this world” will be cast out. The Gospel of the temptation heralds Christ’s victory in advance.

By appointing this Gospel for the beginning of Lent the Church proclaims that the victory should be ours also. In us, as all round us, it is Christ’s temptation, Christ’s struggle, Christ’s victory which is prolonged; our effort is His, and so is our strength; His will be our victory at Easter. Thus we should enter confidently on the struggle whose course is traced for us by St. Paul in today’s epistle. It means a renewal of our whole life as Christians. We should be encouraged by the thought that increase of Christian Life in each of us is a continuance of Christ’s victory.

The liturgy of Lent is a liturgy of confidence. Psalm 90, pre-eminently the Psalm of trust in God, furnishes the Tract and all the chants of today’s Mass; from it are taken also the versicles in the Office until Passiontide. The days of lent are days of salvation; more than any, Lent is the “acceptable time” to amend our lives. The church emphasizes this so at Easter with souls and bodies purified we may celebrate the mystery of the passion and resurrection of the Lord.

Other Church Community News

- **First Friday Night Vigil** at St. Anthony of Padua Church, Quincy starting on March 6, from 8 pm to 2 am: 8:pm Confession and Rosary; 9 pm Mass of the Sacred Heart followed by silent adoration. Midnight : Rosary and benediction; 1 am Mass of the Immaculate Heart of Mary.

- **Hymnals for High Mass** : Hymnals are available in the vestibule if you wish to sing along with the choir. The church has always insisted that everyone should learn how to sing Kyrie, Gloria, Sanctus, and Agnus Dei as well as the Credo. This is called the “ordinary” of the Mass as the text never varies by distinction with the “proper” which are the texts specific to a particular Sunday or feast. The musical setting of the ordinary we will use during Lent is “Mass XVIII” found page 30 of the Hymnal and quite easy to sing. We will continue to sing Credo III (page 34). The credo is our profession of faith and we should all sing it with conviction. Look at the two panels on each side of the side chapels to know the page numbers of entrance and receding hymns. St. Augustine used to say: “To sing is to pray twice.”
- **Traditional St. Patrick’s Day Dinner (Tuesday 17th of March)**: Corned beef from the Butcher Block, cabbage and mashed potatoes at the Church Hall from 11am to 7 pm with carry-outs available. Price includes the meal, dessert and drink (coffee or tea) at \$8 per person, \$5 for children under 12 and families for \$35. Come and enjoy the Irish traditions and be sure to wear your green. Make sure you mark your calendars! Proceeds will help us pay our debt on our marble altars. Music entertainment will include: RagTag Irish Band , Irish Folk Guitarist, Harp Music Canteen Girls with Hot Fingers (violin-piano vocals), Flautissimo Flutes & Vocal Selections. We are in need of volunteers for this important event. There is a sign-up sheet in the vestibule if you can help. Any help will be appreciated!
- **Lent** : Last Sunday, the message of the Holy Father for Lent was included in the Bulletin with the current rules for penance during Lent (fast, abstinence, etc...). If you have lost them, you might find them on St. Rose website www.saintrosequincy.org . You can also find them in the FSSP February Newsletter. However, there is a slight mistake in the Newsletter: fasting is a strict obligation from the 18th birthday until the 59th birthday and not the 60th.
- **Second Collection** : Today, Sunday, the first of March, there will be a second collection as required by the Diocese for Black and Indian Missions. This collection was mandated by the 3rd Council of Baltimore in 1884. The funds are collected by the Black and Indian Mission Office and distributed as grants to dioceses to support and strengthen programs of evangelization which otherwise would cease.
- Come and join us for **Coffee and Donuts** as usual after both Masses every Sunday. No fasting on Sundays of Lent !
- **Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament on Thursdays of Lent** : Thursday is the traditional day of the devotion to the Blessed Sacrament (Institution of the Holy Eucharist on Holy Thursday). The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed immediately after the 12:10 pm Mass. At 6 pm Angelus followed by Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. On Maundy Thursday, adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will take place after the 6 pm Mass until 12 midnight at the altar of repose.
- **Stations of the Cross on Fridays of Lent** : is an excellent way to prepare ourselves to the celebration of the passion, death and resurrection of the Lord during Holy Week. Please, come on Friday at 5:30 pm. The stations will take place every Friday of Lent at 5:30 pm except on Good Friday at 12:10 pm.
- **Adult Religion Class** : After having talked about the liturgy of the Church in general and the sacrifice of the Mass in particular, we will begin the study of the first part of the Mass this coming Wednesday (March 4th) at 6:30 pm in Church Hall. Bring your hand missal.
- **Scripture Class** : Wednesday 10 am Church Hall. Everyone is welcome.
- **Error** : Beware; the date for first communion published earlier in the Bulletin was wrong.... **First communion will take place on Sunday May 24.** And not on May 25 (Memorial Day!). Sunday the 24th of May is the external Solemnity of Ascension in the ecclesiastical province of Chicago. **Reminder:** if your child is not attending the preparation class for first communion at St. Rose, please let the Church secretary, Mrs. Anna Renner, know you wish your child to receive first communion on that day to help us plan for the ceremony.
