

## FROM THE DESK OF FR. D.

At that time Jesus took Peter and James, and John his brother, and bringeth them up into a high Mountain apart: and he was transfigured before them. + Mt 17, 1-2

Why does the evangelist specify the names of the three apostles who were the witnesses of the Transfiguration of Jesus? In the gospels, details of this kind are sometimes of the utmost consequence. We find the same three, Peter, James, and John at another important moment of the life of Christ. It is no longer a time of glory but a time of crisis: during the agony of Jesus in the Garden of the Olives before he is arrested. At the agony, the glory which comes from his divinity is no longer visible. What is visible is an overwhelming anxiety. Knowing what he will have to endure for our redemption, he is already in a state of such intense suffering that he transpires blood. The same three men who saw him in all his glory, bright like the sun, the day of the Transfiguration, see him now in a state of dejection and despondency, covered with blood sweat. What a contrast between the two scenes!

For us, it is a striking illustration of the mystery of Jesus-Christ, God-made-man. Jesus is divine and human; he is true God and true man. Never will we understand perfectly this central mystery of our faith, the mystery of the Incarnation. In order to save us, God became man. This process of divine \* humanization + did not end with the earthly life of Christ; it has become the way by which God manifests himself to us, through which he speaks and acts today. The Catholic Church was instituted by Christ to continue his mission after his return to his heavenly Father. St. Joan of Arc replied to her judges who were trying to fault her belief: \* It seems to me that Christ and Church are all one thing. + She had not studied scholarly theology but she had grasped something of the mystery of the action of God into the world.

God has decreed that every grace must be given through Jesus-Christ who is the only mediator between God and man. He is mediator in virtue of his human nature for as God, he is one with the Father and the Holy Ghost. Every grace that we receive comes to us through Christ as the head commands the members. Since the church continues the mission of Jesus, one may also say that every grace flows to us from God through the church. Even though one may not belong to the church in a visible manner, one is saved through the Catholic Church. The main means by which God is giving us his grace through Jesus-Christ and his church are the seven sacraments. What are the sacraments? Some rites, gestures, ceremonies? Yes but more than that. When we receive a sacrament we are actually in communication with Jesus. A sacrament is truly an action of Jesus himself. The minister acts only *in persona Christi*. It is really Christ who is acting through the priest and the sacrament, giving us his grace.

## Our Church News

- **Eucharistic Adoration for the sanctification of priests :** Following the advice of the Holy See, we should all pray for vocation and for priests. In this bulletin and the following ones, I will publish by increments the document on “Spiritual Motherhood for priests” published by the Pontifical Congregation for Clergy in 2007. I encourage you to read it and meditate it. If you are interested by the entire document, you may download it from <http://www2.clerus.org/>
- **Hymnals for High Mass :** Hymnals are available in the vestibule if you wish to sing along with the choir. The church has always insisted that everyone should learn how to sing Kyrie, Gloria, Sanctus, and Agnus Dei as well as the Credo. This is called the “ordinary” of the Mass as the text never varies by distinction with the “proper” which are the texts specific to a particular Sunday or feast. The musical setting of the ordinary we will use during Lent is “Mass XVIII” found page 30 of the Hymnal and quite easy to sing. We will continue to sing Credo III (page 34). The credo is our profession of faith and we should all sing it with conviction. Look at the two panels on each side of the side chapels to know the page numbers of entrance and receding hymns. St. Augustine used to say: “To sing is to pray twice.”
- **Traditional St. Patrick’s Day Dinner (Tuesday 17<sup>th</sup> of March):** Corned beef from the Butcher Block, cabbage and mashed potatoes at the Church Hall from 11am to 7 pm with carry-outs available. Price includes the meal, dessert and drink (coffee or tea) at \$8 per person, \$5 for children under 12 and families for \$35. Come and enjoy the Irish traditions and be sure to wear your green. Make sure you mark your calendars! Proceeds will help us pay our debt on our marble altars. Music entertainment will include: RagTag Irish Band , Irish Folk Guitarist, Harp Music Canteen Girls with Hot Fingers (violin-piano vocals), Flautissimo Flutes & Vocal Selections. We are in need of volunteers for this event. There is a sign up sheet in the vestibule and hall. Any help will be greatly appreciated!
- **Lent :** Last Sunday, the message of the Holy Father for Lent was included in the Bulletin with the current rules for penance during Lent (fast, abstinence, etc...). If you have lost them, you might find them on St. Rose website [www.saintrosequincy.org](http://www.saintrosequincy.org) . You can also find them in the FSSP February Newsletter. However, there is a slight mistake in the Newsletter: fasting is a strict obligation from the 18<sup>th</sup> birthday until the 59<sup>th</sup> birthday and not the 60<sup>th</sup>.
- **Second Collection :** Next Sunday, the 22<sup>nd</sup> of March, there will be a second collection as required by the Diocese for Catholic Relief Services who work around the world in the name of Christ to provide refugee resettlement, emergency disaster relief, etc... (Green envelope)
- **Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament on Thursdays of Lent :** Thursday is the traditional day of the devotion to the Blessed Sacrament (Institution of the Holy Eucharist on Holy Thursday). The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed immediately after the 12:10 pm Mass. At 6 pm Angelus followed by Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.
- **Adult Religion Class :** is now at **6:30 pm** on Wednesday in Church Hall every other week. Next meetings are on March 18<sup>th</sup> and April First. Bring your hand missal.
- **Scripture Class :** Wednesday 10 am Church Hall every week. Everyone is welcome.
- Come and join us for **Coffee and Donuts** as usual after both Masses every Sunday. No fasting on Sundays of Lent !
