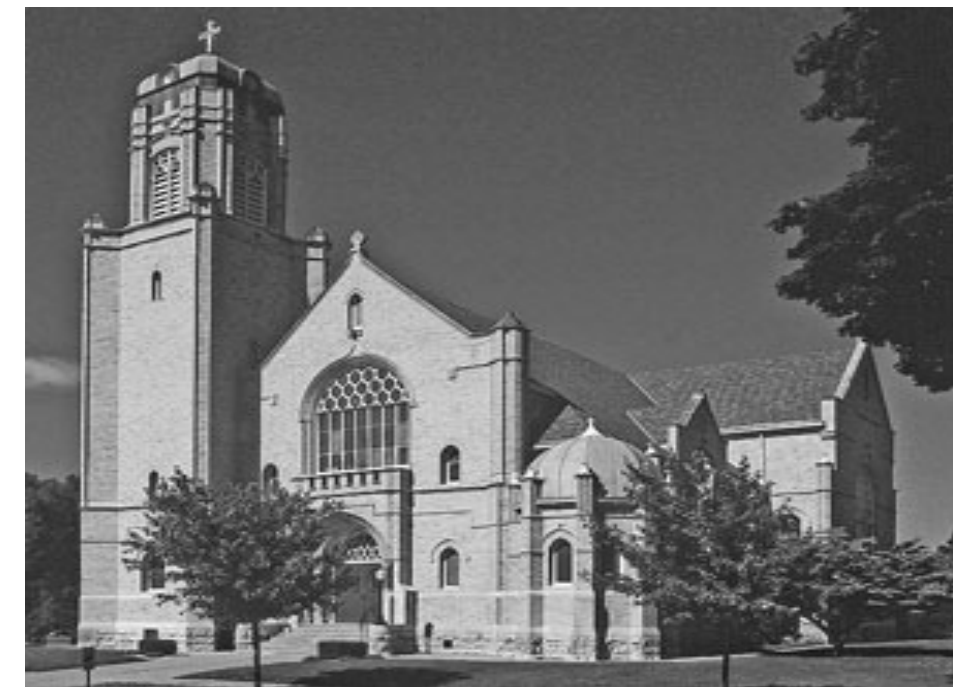

FROM THE DESK OF FR. D.

"If I, by the finger of God, cast out devils;
doubtless the kingdom of God is come upon you"

Besides performing miracles, one of the main ways for our Lord Jesus Christ to prove his claim to be the Messiah and the Son of God was to cast out devils out of possessed peoples. Possession is a sad reality but a reality nonetheless.

Why does God let people to be possessed? One may ask. God is all-good and all-loving; how may he allow such a terrible reality? First of all, we must not forget that we are all free to accept God or refuse him, to love him or not. If someone makes a pact with the devil, he is likely to become possessed. God allows it but he does not make it happen. God allows possession for a greater good: to remind us that the devil exists. The greatest of the devil's tricks is to make people believe he doesn't exist, that he is a figment of the imagination. Possession reminds people that the devil exists and that he is powerful. The devil is out seeking our damnation like a roaring lion looking for a prey... See I Peter 5:8-10.

Some people sometimes try to justify themselves by saying: "the devil made me do it". Let us not deceive ourselves: the devil cannot make us sin, he can only tempt us; we always remain free to resist or not to his suggestions.

The devil tempts us and tries to deceive us. Once the most beautiful creature (his name is Lucifer, the Light bearer) and the most intelligent of all, we must be very careful not to be deceived. The devil will tempt us under the

appearance of good. He will have us believe something wrong in itself becomes right if done for the proper intention. Something intrinsically evil remains as such however good is our reason to do it.

Fear the devil but do not become overcome by fear. Christ has already conquered him by his own death and resurrection. No temptation is too strong to overcome with the grace of God. If we happen to fall into the snares of the enemy, let us not forget that they can be forgiven through the merits of Christ if we have the proper contrition for them.

Our Lord Jesus Christ left us behind some wonderful means to overcome the devil and avoid falling down into his traps: the sacraments and especially the sacrament of penance. When we go to confession, we are reconciled with God through the merits of Our Lord. Through confession, we defeat the devil's tricks by our humility and acknowledgment of our faults. The sacrament gives us the light to see clearly the will of God and the strength to accomplish it. The confessor, thanks to the special grace of his office, helps us by his spiritual advice to discern between the temptations of the deceiver and the will of God. Let us always remember St. Paul's saying: "Nothing is impossible for he who loves God".

Our Church News

- **Thursday 19th of March** is a first class feast: the feast of St. Joseph, spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Pope Leo XIII proclaimed St. Joseph, the Patron Saint of the Universal Church. It is not a holy day of obligation in America. There will be two Masses: **7:30 am & 12:10 pm**. Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament after the 12:10 pm Mass and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament at 6 pm.
- **St. Patrick's Day is near! This coming Tuesday (17th of March)**. St. Patrick is a second class feast at St. Rose's as it is the secondary Patron Saint of our church. Two Masses: **7:30 am & 12:10 pm**. The early Mass is offered for all those who are involved in the preparation and serving of our St. Patrick's Dinner. The dinner takes place from 11 am until 7 pm: Corned beef from the Butcher Block, cabbage and mashed potatoes at the Church Hall from 11am to 7 pm with carry-outs available. - **Scripture Class**: Wednesday 10 am Church Hall every week. Everyone is welcome.
- **Second Collection** : Next Sunday, the 22nd of March, there will be a second collection as required by the Diocese for Catholic Relief Services who work around the world in the name of Christ to provide refugee resettlement, emergency disaster relief, etc... (Green envelope)
- **Flowers**: If you wish to make a donation in memory of a loved one/ones and have that donation used for Easter flowers, please fill out an envelope provided on the table in the vestibule. The flower committee will

purchase your flowers for you. Please make sure all information is listed: Name/names of remembered & your name.
