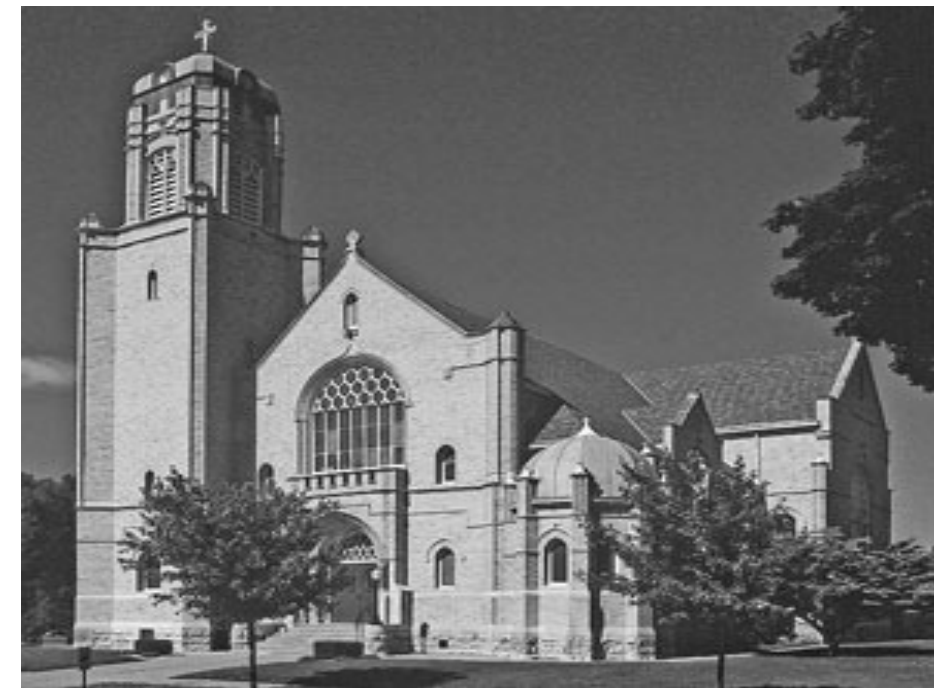

## From the Desk of Fr. D

### Passion Sunday

"Truly, truly, I tell you that whoever holds fast to my word will not see death."

Last week and this week as well, gospels are taken from the chapters 7 to 12 of the Gospel according to St. John where Jesus' fate is in the making. The drama reaches its climax. Jesus reveals his divinity; first in a veiled manner; then in a manner which leaves no doubt in the mind of his listeners: "Before Abraham existed, I am."

His listeners are not mistaken: it is for them an incredible claim, a blasphemy, he cannot but be sentenced to death for such a claim. But St. John tells us the hour is not yet come. Jesus has not yet delivered himself into their hands.

Who is Jesus? Where does he come from? Where is he going? Three questions the Jews are asking themselves. They do not know what to think of the man Jesus. In one hand he performs miracles showing himself a prophet, a messenger from God. On the other hand, his claims are more and more unacceptable.

The Word is light and life: this is the message of the Gospel according to St. John already strongly stated in the prologue. Jesus shows it by the healing of the man born

blind and the resurrection of Lazarus. These two miracles are the illustration of two speeches: In the first Jesus affirms he is the light of the world: "He who follows me, will not walk in the darkness but he will have the light of the life". In the other speech, Jesus is the good Pastor who gives up his life for his sheep so they may have eternal life.

The structure of the prologue shows us what the mission of Jesus is. He comes from the Father: "He was at the beginning with God, he came into the world so that those who would receive him would become children of God". He has come down from the Father to return with those who accept him and believe in him.

To believe in the teaching of Jesus, it is also necessary to change one's heart, to convert, to put into practice the teaching of Jesus. "Love one another as I have loved you." How much should we love our neighbor? The same way as Our Lord loved us! "Knowing that his hour had come to go from this world to the Father, having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end", to the extremity of love. The Passion shows us how we should love our neighbor. We must try to understand the depth of this love if we wish to keep the word of Christ and never see death.

### DID YOU KNOW?

Before our church was reopened for the Latin Mass, it had been completely stripped from its furniture. The only things left were the stain glasses, the pews, and the pipe organ... The Latin Mass Society of Quincy started early on in 2008 to restore the church. Thousands of hours were put in by volunteers cleaning, repairing, and painting to make this church beautiful.

Because nothing is too beautiful for God, 3 marble altars and an altar rail were purchased and installed. With some of the extra railing, the marble pulpit was built.

To date we still owe \$32,500 down from \$85,000 for the installation and we are on a 36 months payment plan for the purchase. Thanks to St. Patrick's dinner proceeds, we are able to reimburse an extra \$4,500 this week. So more than 2/3 of the installation cost has already been paid.

The two side altars, communion rail, sound and bell tower systems were donated by members of the community in memory of members of their family and a commemorative plaque has been installed.

We are still looking for donors for the high altar and the pulpit. If you are interested in making a donation for the main altar or pulpit, please contact Father.
