This community was established by Bishop George Lucas, Bishop of Springfield, in the fall of 2008 for the celebration of the extraordinary form of the Roman Missal (Traditional Latin Mass). If you are not familiar with this rite, do not hesitate to ask for help from the ushers.

To follow the liturgy on Sunday, you need a red booklet (pews) and the Sunday proper leaflet (vestibule). For sung Masses, you may also wish to take a hymnal (vestibule) to sing along.

On weekdays, you need a Latin-English Missal. They are available at Poppe's in Quincy and at the St. John Fisher Bookstore in Jacksonville (See back of the Bulletin). You may also follow the ordinary in the red booklet.

Do not hesitate to make the responses along with the altar boys, if you are able to do so.

# From the Desk of Fr. D

Tuesday, August 4, 2009 is the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the death of St. John Mary Baptist Vianney, Curé of Ars. Usually saints are celebrated on the day of their death: the day of their birth to eternal life. When pope Pius XI canonized the Curé of Ars he decided that the saint would be celebrated on August 9 as August 4 was the feast of St. Dominic, the founder of the Dominicans. However, August 9 was also the celebration of the vigil of St. Laurence, secondary patron saint of the diocese of Rome. When the reform of the calendar was made in 1960, it was decided to move the feast of St. John Vianney a day earlier to emphasize again the vigil of St. Laurence. In 1969, the calendar was again changed and the feast of St. John Mary Vianney was swapped with the feast of St. Dominic. So in the ordinary form of the Roman rite, St. John Vianney is celebrated on the 4<sup>th</sup> of August and St. Dominic on the 8<sup>th</sup> of August while in the extraordinary form of the Roman Missal it is the opposite. Because of the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of his death on August 4<sup>th</sup> and the special indulgence attached to that anniversary, we will exceptionally, this year only, celebrate St. John Vianney on Tuesday, the 4<sup>th</sup> of August and St. Dominic on the 8<sup>th</sup> of August.

“The Plenary Indulgence is granted to all the faithful who are truly repentant who, in church or in chapel,

devoutly attend the divine Sacrifice of Mass and offer prayers to Jesus Christ the Eternal High Priest, for the priests of the Church, and any other good work which they have done on that day, so that he may sanctify them and form them in accordance with His Heart, as long as they have made expiation for their sins through sacramental confession and prayed in accordance with the Supreme Pontiff's intentions: on the days in which the Year for Priests begins and ends, **on the day of the 150th anniversary of the pious passing of St John Mary Vianney (August 4), on the first Thursday of the month (August 6)** or on any other day established by the local Ordinaries for the benefit of the faithful.”

“Lastly, the Partial Indulgence is granted to all the faithful every time they devoutly recite five Our Fathers, Hail Marys and Glorias, or another expressly approved prayer, in honor of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, to obtain that priests be preserved in purity and holiness of life.” Official Decree:

- **Tuesday, August 4<sup>th</sup>**, 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the death of St. John Vianney. Plenary indulgence.
- **Thursday, August 6<sup>th</sup>**, Feast of the Transfiguration, First Thursday. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament until 6 pm. Plenary indulgence.

Only one Mass at St. Rose 12:10 pm. This year the feast of the Assumption is not a holy day of obligation in America as it falls on a Saturday.

There will be a special dinner after the 11 am High Mass. More later. This is also the first (of three) day of prayer for the election (=selection) of the new bishop.
- **Administrator elected**: The College of Consultors elected the Vicar general, **Msgr Carl Kemme**, as Administrator of the Diocese. Please pray for him. The Administrator governs the diocese until a new bishop is appointed by the Holy Father. Let us continue to pray for the Holy Father and those who are involved in the process of the selection of a new bishop.
- **Sunday school**: Have you registered your children for our CCD program? It takes place after the 8 am Mass (around 9 am) and lasts about an hour.
