**Welcome to St. Rose**

This community was established by Bishop George Lucas, Bishop of Springfield, in the fall of 2008 for the celebration of the extraordinary form of the Roman Missal (Traditional Latin Mass). If you are not familiar with this rite, do not hesitate to ask for help from the ushers.

To follow the liturgy on Sunday, you need a red booklet (pews) and the Sunday proper leaflet (vestibule). For sung Masses, you may also wish to take a hymnal (vestibule) to sing along.

On weekdays, you need a Latin-English Missal. They are available at Poppe's in Quincy and at the St. John Fisher Bookstore in Jacksonville (See back of the Bulletin). You may also follow the ordinary in the red booklet.

Do not hesitate to make the responses along with the altar boys, if you are able to do so.

# From the Desk of Fr. D

One usually distinguishes 3 fruits to the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass:

A general fruit applicable to all faithful and particularly to those assisting to the Mass and their intention.

A particular fruit reserved to the celebrant and the intentions he formulates in the two mementos.

A special fruit applicable to the intention of a donator who offers a stipend. A priest can only accept one stipend per Mass and he can retain only one stipend a day even though he may offer several Masses.

A stipend is not the "price" of a Mass. A Mass has an infinite value. It cannot be evaluated or given a price. It is more a participation to Divine worship and a help to the priest. It is a sign of deep faith and charity to unite oneself to the Sacrifice of Christ the offering of one's toil and work under the form of a stipend to obtain for oneself or someone else a particular grace. It is not the price of a given service although the IRS considered it this way and you will not receive a tax credit for it... Dioceses fix an amount for stipends in order to avoid abuses.

Offering a Mass for someone is actually a great act of charity towards our neighbor, especially those who have left this world for the next. The Mass will shorten their time in

purgatory. We are now posting the Mass intentions in the Bulletin. If you need some Masses offered for a specific intentions, do not hesitate to call our secretary. She may be able to schedule them for specific days.

What are Gregorian Masses?

Gregorian Masses is the celebration of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass for the repose of the soul of deceased during 30 consecutive days without interruption. This tradition goes back to St. Gregory the Great. In his Dialogues (book IV, ch. 55) he tells the following story: a certain Roman monk died after committing a fault against poverty. St. Gregory invited the Abbott to have a Mass celebrated for the repose of his soul during 30 consecutive days. The monk appeared afterwards free from the flames of purgatory thanks to those 30 Masses.

Parish Priests cannot usually offer Gregorian Masses as they have to offer Mass for their parishioners. If you are looking for a community of monks to offer the traditional Latin Mass, you may wish to contact Clear Creek Monastery, 5804 W. Monastery Rd., Hulbert OK 74441-5698. You may wish to contact them beforehand to know how much the stipend is (probably around \$350).
