Welcome to St. Rose

This community was established by Bishop George Lucas, Bishop of Springfield, in the fall of 2008 for the celebration of the extraordinary form of the Roman Missal (Traditional Latin Mass). If you are not familiar with this rite, do not hesitate to ask for help from the ushers.

To follow the liturgy on Sunday, you need a red booklet (pews) and the Sunday proper leaflet (vestibule). For sung Masses, you may also wish to take a hymnal (vestibule) to sing along.

On weekdays, you need a Latin-English Missal. They are available at Poppe's in Quincy and at the St. John Fisher Bookstore in Jacksonville (See back of the Bulletin). You may also follow the ordinary in the red booklet.

Do not hesitate to make the responses along with the altar boys, if you are able to do so.

On Sundays and Holy Days, please come and join us after Mass in the Church hall for coffee and donuts.

From the Desk of Fr. D

I am happy to announce that two young men –who have been involved with the extraordinary form of the Roman Missal since its inception in the Diocese of Springfield– will begin the road to the priesthood this fall, one who has attended Mass regularly at St. Rose of Lima since the reopening of the church and the other one who has attended the Saturday Morning Mass at Blessed Sacrament Church in Springfield. Both have been serving Mass regularly.

God willing, one will become a priest of the Diocese of Springfield while the other one a priest of the Priestly Fraternity of St. Peter. They both will begin the arduous studies (5 to 7 years) required by the church later in August. One will study at Kenrick-Glennon Seminary in Saint Louis and the other at Our Lady Of Guadalupe Seminary in Lincoln.

A priestly vocation these days, in our materialistic culture, is just short of miraculous! We will accompany them with our prayers as they give themselves to the Lord. Everyone is aware of the current shortage of priests. The problem will not be resolved quickly. It will get worse before it gets better. Let us do our part and pray for these two young men so that they persevere to the call of God and let us pray for more young men in our community to answer God's call.

A priestly vocation is a personal call of Jesus to continue His mission to teach the truth that God has deigned to reveal to us, to sanctify through the sacraments instituted by Christ, and to

guide others on the rocky way which leads to salvation.

Today, we have mixed feelings. We are happy that Mr. Jason Stone is answering the call of God and that he is going to seminary. We are sad that he is leaving us since he has given so much of his time and energy directing our choir and playing the organ. He will be sorely missed. We hope he will visit us often.

I am taking advantage of the occasion for expressing my gratitude to the two seminarians who have been with us at St. Rose this summer. First, Mr. Kevin Drew, who is a seminarian of the Diocese of Kansas-City, has been a tremendous help this summer, helping in the sacristy and serving Mass whenever necessary. He has already left Quincy and should return to Kenrick sometime later this week.

Last but not least, Mr. Mark Kemna, who has been a huge presence this summer at St. Rose. As everyone knows he is a 4th year FSSP seminarian at Guadalupe Seminary, always ready to engage in a lively conversation and to answer any question. Mark is still with us for a few days before returning to Nebraska where he will be joined by First Year Mr. John Bultman of Springfield.

Let us keep Jason and Mark, Kevin and John in our prayers as they begin or pursue their training to become priests of the Most High, the Lord almighty and all merciful.

• **Sunday school:** Have you registered your children for our CCD program? It takes place after the 8 am Mass (around 9 am) and lasts about an hour. Classes will resume on Sunday, September 6. There will be 3 or 4 groups according to numbers. If you are interested to teach full time or part time, let me know. We are still planning to have our confirmations late this year. Stay tune.

• **Adult Religion Class:** on second and fourth Wednesday of the month at 6:30 pm. First Class on September 9. We will go through the Catechism of the Catholic Church and its compendium and deal with other subjects as needed. To have an idea of the number of books we need, please call the rectory to let us know if you are planning to attend.

• **Latin Class:** every Thursday at 6:30 pm. Thank you to all those who registered. If you have not done so, it is not too late to do so. We will use the two volume method "The New Missal Latin" of Fr. Edmund J. Baumeister first published in 1941. It has the advantage to focus on the extraordinary form of the Latin Mass (in spite of its name!) and to be very thorough. This class is open to adults and teenagers. The full price is \$20. No need to order it as we will make a bulk order to get a discount...

• **Hall Freezer News:** This summer the compressor of our 40-year old commercial freezer 'gave up the ghost'. To install a new compressor would cost between \$1,500 and \$2,000. Our Church Council was unanimous in thinking that to place a new compressor in this old freezer was not a good idea. Although the compressor for the refrigerator part is still functioning, it might die of old age anytime. Right now, the church does not have the financial means to buy a new professional quality freezer. The best solution would be to retire the current cooler entirely (it is not very energy effective) and to replace it with 3 separate units: 2 refrigerators and 1 freezer. We are looking at a minimum of \$4,000. Until we are able to do so, a small inexpensive (\$200) chest freezer will be installed in the pre-kitchen area. Once finances allow us to replace the current cooler entirely, this temporary freezer will be relocated in the rectory.
