Welcome to St. Rose

This community was established by Bishop George Lucas, Bishop of Springfield, in the fall of 2008 for the celebration of the extraordinary form of the Roman Missal (Traditional Latin Mass). If you are not familiar with this rite, do not hesitate to ask for help from the ushers.

To follow the liturgy on Sunday, you need a red booklet (pews) and the Sunday proper leaflet (vestibule). For sung Masses, you may also wish to take a hymnal (vestibule) to sing along.

On weekdays, you need a Latin-English Missal. They are available at Poppe's in Quincy and at the St. John Fisher Bookstore in Jacksonville (See back of the Bulletin). You may also follow the ordinary in the red booklet.

Do not hesitate to make the responses along with the altar boys, if you are able to do so.

To join the St. Rose of Lima Chaplaincy, please call the parish office at 217-222-2511 or mail one of the cards found in the back of the Church.

On Sundays and Holy Days, please come and join us after Mass in the Church hall for coffee and donuts.

The collect of today's Mass begins with the invocation of *Omnipotens et misericors Deus*, 'Omnipotent and Merciful God'. It is quite frequent in the address of the collects of the Roman liturgy to invoke those two attributes of God, separately or together. After the heading comes a truth of spiritual life: without God's grace, we would not be able to serve God in a worthy and praiseworthy manner. The last part of the prayer is the request proper: we ask God to help us run without stumbling towards what He has promised us (Eternal Life).

Most modern vernacular translations of similar prayers in the ordinary form of the Roman Missal omit the term "almighty" and translate "Merciful Father". In this context, the Pope recently (July 24, 2009) made the following comment: «I do not know why the word "omnipotent" has been omitted from the Italian text, but it is true that we feel a little threatened by the word "omnipotence": it seems to limit our freedom, it seems to be too strong. But we must learn that the omnipotence of God is not an arbitrary power, because God is Good, he is Truth, and therefore he can do anything, but he may not act against good, he may not act against truth, love or freedom, because he himself is good, love, and true freedom. And therefore nothing he

does can ever be in contrast with truth, love and freedom. The contrary is true. He, God, is the guardian of our freedom, of love and of truth. This eye which looks upon us is not an evil eye watching us; it is the presence of love which will never abandon us but rather gives us the certainty that Good is being, Good is living: it is the eye of love that gives us the air to live.

Almighty and Merciful God. A Roman prayer, connected with the text of the Book of Wisdom, says: "O God, show your omnipotence through pardon and mercy". (See *the Collect of the 10th Sunday after Pentecost and Wisdom 11:24*) The summit of God's power is mercy, pardon. In our modern-day worldly concept of power, we think of someone who owns large estates, who has some say in the world of economics, who has capital and can influence the world of the market. We think of someone who has military power, who can threaten. Stalin's question, "How many armed divisions does the Pope have?" still characterizes the common idea of power. Whoever has power and many worldly effects may be dangerous, as he could threaten and destroy. But Revelations tells us. "It is not so"; true power is the power of grace and of mercy. In his mercy, God demonstrates true power.

- **Census Form for Registered Members of St. Rose of Lima:** please pick up a census form in the vestibule, fill it out and return it to our Church Secretary so we have a more complete idea of the size of our community. This questionnaire is necessary to finalize your membership in the Chaplaincy. This information will be kept strictly confidential. Only the Chaplain and the Secretary will have access to it. Do not drop the questionnaire in the collection basket but give it personally to the secretary or send it by mail to her attention. If you are not a registered member, just fill out one of the cards in the vestibule and drop it in the collection basket.
- **The Dave Ramsey Financial Peace University (FPU) begins Tuesday, September 8th at 6:30pm in the Church Hall.
