Welcome to St. Rose

This community was established by Bishop George Lucas, former Bishop of Springfield, in the fall of 2008 for the celebration of the extraordinary form of the Roman Missal (Traditional Latin Mass). If you are not familiar with this rite, do not hesitate to ask for help from the ushers.

To follow the liturgy on Sunday, you need a red booklet (pews) and the Sunday proper leaflet (vestibule). For sung Masses, you may also wish to take a hymnal (vestibule) to sing along.

On weekdays, you need a Latin-English Missal. They are available at Poppe's in Quincy & St. John Fisher Bookstore in Jacksonville (see back of bulletin). You may also follow the ordinary in the red booklet.

Do not hesitate to make the responses along with the altar boys, if you are able to do so.

On Sundays and Holy Days, please come and join us after Mass in the Church hall for coffee and donuts.

From the Desk of Fr. D

C'est la Rentrée!, the French say at the start of a new school or academic year. We begin today our CCD Sunday School which will take place every Sunday after the 8am Mass from 9am until approximately 10am. As last year we use the St. Joseph Baltimore Catechism Series. We are still planning to have confirmations late this fall (November). Our *confirmandi* still have much to learn since they did not begin the preparation until November last year.

This week we also begin our 3 weekday classes:

On Tuesday, September 8, at 6:30 pm begins the Dave Ramsey Financial Peace University in the hall under the direction of Terry Meats. If you have not registered, you are still welcome to attend. The fee of \$100 per family covers the cost of materials. Both spouses and their teenage children are welcome to attend. It will run for 13 weeks.

On Thursday, September 10, at 6:30pm (after Benediction), we begin our Latin Course focusing on liturgical Latin. We will go through Latin pronunciation and a few grammatical questions during the first class. Latin Classes will be every week.

Last but not least, on Wednesday, September 9, at 6:30pm, we begin our Adult Religion Course. High School and College students are also welcome! It will be every other week to begin with. It will last about an hour. We shall follow the Compendium of the Catechism of the Catholic Church promulgated by Pope Benedict XVI in 2005. Since it is a summary of the Catechism itself, we will keep the latter as a reference. Compendium and Catechism are available at Poppe's and at the Rectory. Please read Section one of Part one of the Compendium before Class and make sure you have a lot of questions!

The Holy Father describes the *Compendium* as follows: "a faithful and sure synthesis of the Catechism of the Catholic Church. It contains, in concise form, all the essential and fundamental elements of the Church's faith, thus constituting a kind of *vademecum* which allows believers and non-believers alike to behold the entire panorama of the Catholic faith. With its brevity, clarity and comprehensiveness, it is directed to every human being, who, in a world of distraction and multifarious messages, desires to know the Way of Life, the Truth, entrusted by God to his Son's Church."

- **Adult Religion Class:** on second and fourth Wednesday of the month at 6:30 pm. **First Class on September 9.** We will go through the official *Catechism of the Catholic Church* and its *Compendium* and deal with other subjects as needed.
- **Latin Class:** every Thursday at 6:30 pm starting September 10. Thank you to all those who have registered. If you have not done so, it is not too late to do so. We will use the two volume method "The New Missal Latin" of Fr. Edmund J. Baumeister first published in 1941. It has the advantage to focus on the extraordinary form of the Latin Mass (in spite of its name!) and to be very thorough. This class is open to adults and teenagers. The first year volume (hardbound) is available at the rectory for \$15 (a \$7 saving thanks to the generosity of the St. John Fisher Forum)...
- **Pope Benedict XVI's general prayer intention** for September is: "That the word of God may be better known, welcomed and lived as the source of freedom and joy".
