This community was established by Bishop George Lucas, former Bishop of Springfield, in the fall of 2008 for the celebration of the extraordinary form of the Roman Missal (Traditional Latin Mass). If you are not familiar with this rite, do not hesitate to ask for help from the ushers.

To follow the liturgy on Sunday, you need a red booklet (pews) and the Sunday proper leaflet (vestibule). For sung Masses, you may also wish to take a hymnal (vestibule) to sing along.

On weekdays, you need a Latin-English Missal. They are available at Poppe's in Quincy & St. John Fisher Bookstore in Jacksonville (see back of bulletin). You may also follow the ordinary in the red booklet.

Do not hesitate to make the responses along with the altar boys, if you are able to do so.

Exaltation of the Holy Cross

This occasion of this feast is the anniversary of the finding of the true cross (September 14, 320) by St. Helen, Mother of the Emperor Constantine, and the Consecration of the church of the Holy Sepulcher at Jerusalem. Later the “finding” was celebrated on May 3, and the present date commemorated the recovery of the cross from the Persians by Emperor Heraclius in the year 628. The king himself delivered the holy relics to the patriarch Zacharias on May 3, 630. Thus the occasion for the feast underwent a change.

The church celebrates the feast now at the beginning of autumn; the Cross is “raised” against the rising darkness, a symbol of the might of hell. The Church wishes “to raise the Sign of the Son of Man” which will appear at His Second Coming. This feast belongs to the most ancient legacies of the liturgy.

Hardly ever does the liturgy view the Cross as an instrument of torture; rather it is the sign of redemption, the sign of triumph and victory over hell. The cross is presented under the most varied forms such as a royal banner, the tree of life adorned with the purple of the King, a bal-

ance upon which the ransom of mankind was weighed out, an emblem of the victory of redemption.

“O Cross, more refulgent than all the stars, honored throughout the world, deeply loved by men, holiest of all things: You alone were worthy to bear the price of the world’s ransom. O sweet wood, O sweet nails, that held so sweet a burden: save this flock gathered today to sing your praises.” “By all kings the holy Cross is lifted on high; the royal scepter with which the Savior triumphs is erected.” “O holy Cross, You have brought salvation to the languishing! How should I praise You, since You have opened the kingdom of heaven to us!”

“It was Your will that from the wood of the Cross man’s salvation should go forth. From a tree came death, from a tree also should come forth life. He who triumphed on a tree [the devil] should also be defeated on a tree.” (Preface)
