Welcome to St. Rose

This community was established by Bishop George Lucas, former Bishop of Springfield, in the fall of 2008 for the celebration of the extraordinary form of the Roman Missal (Traditional Latin Mass). If you are not familiar with this rite, do not hesitate to ask for help from the ushers.

To follow the liturgy on Sunday, you need a red booklet (pews) and the Sunday proper leaflet (vestibule). For sung Masses, you may also wish to take a hymnal (vestibule) to sing along.

On weekdays, you need a Latin-English Missal. They are available at Poppe's in Quincy & St. John Fisher Bookstore in Jacksonville (see back of bulletin). You may also follow the ordinary in the red booklet.

Do not hesitate to make the responses along with the altar boys, if you are able to do so.

On Sundays and Holy Days, please come and join us after Mass in the Church hall for coffee and donuts.

From the Desk of Fr. D

The observance of the Ember Days, a most venerable feature of the liturgical calendar, dates back to early Roman antiquity. Originally the Ember Days were an occasion of thanksgiving for the three great harvests of wheat, grapes, and olives - all very meaningful nature symbols employed by the liturgy. In the Offertory procession the faithful brought tithes of the harvest to be used for the offering then and there, for the support of the church, and for the poor.

Four times a year - Advent (winter), Lent (spring), Pentecost (summer), September (fall) - at the change of seasons, three days of the week - Wednesday, Friday, Saturday- were devoted to prayer and fasting to implore God's blessings on the new season. These days stress spiritual renewal. In the bustle of business and work, we too easily forget our future status. Therefore, during these four times of the year we should concentrate on God and scrutinize our spiritual condition. If lent is our annual retreat, Ember Days serve as quarterly check-ups. A grave and earnest

mood comes over Mother Church (purple vestments are indicative of penitential days), but there are no tears or mourning. Fasting is not so much an expression of penitence and sorrow as a joyous tithe to God, and an incentive to almsgiving. Today, there is no obligation of fasting but it is keeping with the time to do some fasting or some other type of penance.

Ember Wednesdays have two readings before the Gospel while Ember Saturdays have five! However a shorter Mass was with only two readings is allowed when it is not a conventual Mass (Main Mass in a monastery) or a ceremony of ordination. Indeed Ember Saturdays are traditional days for ordination. Each step on the road to the priesthood is given at a different time during the Mass: tonsure, porter & lector; exorcist & acolyte; subdeacon; deacon; priest.
