Welcome to St. Rose

Did you know that the Council Vatican II declared that "The use of the Latin language, with due respect to particular law, is to be preserved in the Latin rites"? At St. Rose, it is certainly the case. However, you may not be used to Latin so it will take you some time to get familiar with the extraordinary form of the Roman Rite. We provide you with some brief indications below but do not hesitate to ask for help. St. Rose Latin Mass Chaplaincy is a Catholic community established by the Bishop of Springfield in the fall of 2008.

On Sunday, you may follow Mass with a red booklet (pews) and a Proper leaflet (vestibule). Hymnals are also available for Sung Masses (vestibule). On Weekdays, you need a daily Latin -English Missal to follow Mass. They are available at Poppe's (1886 Maine, Quincy). You may also follow the ordinary with a red booklet.

There are collection or donation envelopes available in pews and vestibule for visitors. If you wish to receive a tax receipt or/and be kept informed on the life and activities of our community at St. Rose, make sure you give us your name and address. To join the chaplaincy, call the church office.

On Sunday, please do come to the hall after Mass to meet the community. Coffee & Donuts are available.

† God Bless all those not here... That should be. †

“Be nothing solicitous, but in everything ... let your supplications be known to God.” The phrase “to be solicitous” in the English of the Douay-Rheims translation of the Bible (XIX c. revision by Canon Challoner) does not mean to seek something from someone or to seek someone’s attention but rather to be anxious, to worry. St. Paul, today, urges us to be happy, to rejoice, to have no anxiety: a frequent theme for him. The whole liturgy today is an invitation to joy. Let us face it: we tend to worry too often about almost anything...

What should we do to overcome these anxieties? "Amen I say to you unless you turn and become like little children you will not enter the kingdom of heaven." "Let the little children come to me for the kingdom of God is for them."

If our Lord asks us to become like little children, it is precisely because children do not worry. They know that their parents will not allow any evil to be done to them. How much more our heavenly Father will take care of those who abandon themselves into His hands!

God does not take away our cross but He will give us the light necessary to understand the usefulness of our cross and the strength to bear it. “Hear our prayers, O Lord, and, by the grace of Thy visitation enlighten the darkness of our mind.” (3rd Sunday of Advent Collect).

The true Christian knows that God will never abandon him, that God will always forgive his sins as long as he is truly sorry for them, that his salvation is more the work of God than his own. He knows that God gave him wonderful means to be saved: the Church as a guide, the sacraments, especially the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. He knows that through sanctifying grace God made him His own child, that God dwells in him and guides him through the Holy Ghost.

The special grace of Christmas is precisely the peace and joy given to the world, given to us because *a Savior has been born unto us*. God decided that His only Son would become a helpless child to show us that we must, too, become like little children, without worry, at peace because trusting his Divine Providence.

- **Sunday, December 12, 3rd Sunday of Advent; Second Collection for the Retirement Fund for Religious**, which provides assistance for the care of elderly Catholic sisters, brothers and religious order priests. As St. Paul states, “Let us do good to all, but especially to those who belong to the family of the faith” (Galatians 6:10). **3 pm Fatima Rosary Rally:** 15 decades Rosary, Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament, and Enrollment in the Brown Scapular.
- Wednesday, December 15, Ember Wednesday of Advent. Religion Class 6:30 pm: The fifth commandment: Thou shall not kill! Read Compendium #466-486.
- Thursday, December 16, St. Eusebius. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament until 6 pm. Latin II Exercises 40 C & D.
- **Sunday, December 19, 4th Sunday of Advent.** Church Council after 11 am Mass in rectory. Any member of the community who would like to bring an item to the attention of our church council, please let our church secretary know by Friday, December 17.

- **Memorials for Christmas:** Would you like your deceased loved one/ones remembered in flowers this Christmas? You may use the envelopes provided in the vestibule to indicate: loved ones' name, your name and place amount you would like to donate inside envelope. Indicate the colors of poinsettia you wish to contribute to. Your donation may be turned into the office or placed in collection basket on Sunday. A listing will appear in the bulletin and on the bulletin board in the vestibule.
- **The 2011 Liturgical Calendar** of the *Priestly Fraternity of St. Peter* is available for pick up at the rectory if you have ordered it. The advertised price is \$13 but they are available to you for only \$10. Also, we have a few copies left of the 2011 Calendar published by *Angelus Press* at the rectory. If you are interested, please come to the rectory or call our secretary, Anna Renner. First come, first served! They cost \$11.95 10.00 a piece.
- **Christmas Cards:** St. Rose of Lima has two Christmas Cards available in a set of 20 (10 of each) for a donation of \$12. The first one is a reproduction of our back window: the seven angels/spirits before the throne of God and the other one a reproduction of our gospel-side window: the Nativity scene. A few sets are available in the vestibule.

NEWS

- **FSSP PRIEST IN RESIDENCE:** Fr. Thomas Fritschen, FSSP, is moving to Quincy and will reside at St. Rose of Lima Church. As he is recovering from a bicycle accident, he will not be able to do more than say Mass, preach, and hear confessions. We welcome him to St. Rose. It will be easier to have solemn liturgies! Fr. Fritschen hails from Seattle, Washington; he has been a priest since 2000. He was stationed for a number of years in Colorado Springs and more recently in Atlanta. He is coming in time for Christmas.
- **Ushers & Counters: Thank you to all who have volunteered as ushers and collection counters** since our community’s inception. Your help has been greatly appreciated. However, **we need more volunteers** so the same people do not have to count the collections more than once a month. The collections are counted immediately after the 11 am Mass on Sunday or the last Mass of the Day on other days. Even if you are used to attending the early Mass on Sunday, consider coming once a month to the High Mass for this service. We need 10 adults (21+) who can count and/or use an adding machine... Call our secretary to volunteer. As soon as we have the required number, we will organize a meeting where the procedure is explained.
- **A New Gregorian Chant CD, *Voices – Chant from Avignon***, has just been released by Decca Records and it is available from Poppe’s. It was recorded by the Benedictine Nuns of Our Lady of the Annunciation Abbey in Le Barroux, France, who were selected among 70 other monasteries and convents in Europe.
